

## DIRECTIONS

From I-93 (North or South):

Take Exit 17, and head East on 3A (Hoit Rd.) about a half mile until the blinking light.

Turn Left on Route 132, heading North.

Continue 0.8 miles, eventually turning right onto New Road, and follow signs for the Fair and Fair Parking.

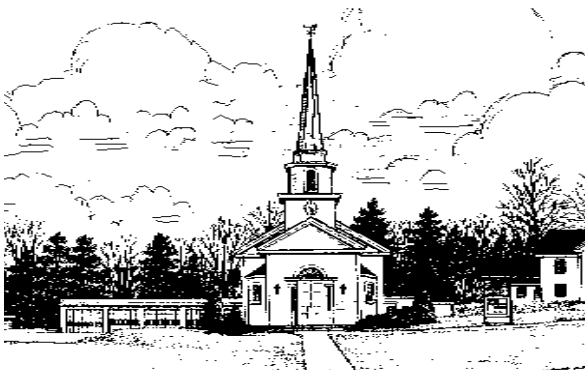
From Route 106 (in Loudon):

Take Shaker Road at the lights by the 106 Beanstalk Store. Continue on Shaker Road 1.7 miles, turning left on to Baptist Road.

Continue towards Town center, following signs for Fair parking.



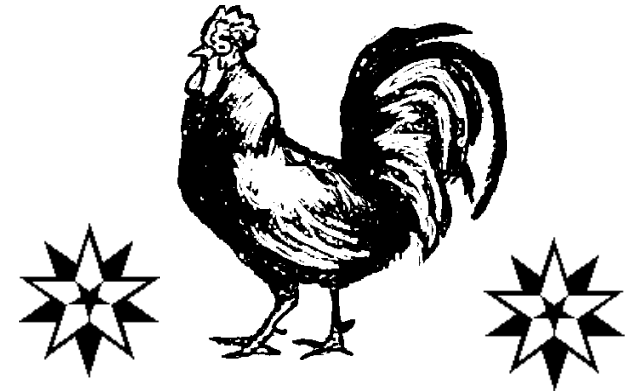
The Canterbury Fair is an outgrowth of the church suppers and sales held by the Ladies Benevolent Society to benefit the Canterbury United Community Church prior to 1959, and the Ladies Society ran the Fair through 1965. Since that time, a town-wide committee has overseen the Fair, and proceeds benefit the Church and the Canterbury Fund, a charitable fund that gives out book awards and scholarships for local student graduates, helps during family emergencies, and supports a variety of community projects.

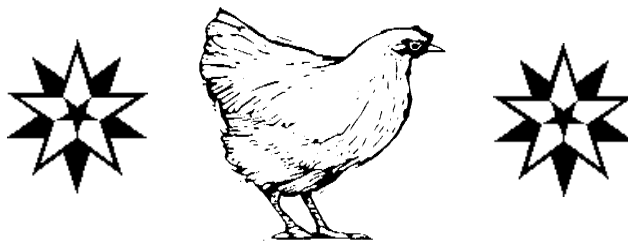
## CHICKEN BBQ
